St. Brigid's Day Crosses made by St Brigid's National School, Ticknevin, will be available for sale at masses this weekend on Saturday 28th and Sunday 29th of January in our church in Derrinturn. All monies raised will go towards school funds. The St. Brigid's Cross was traditionally believed to protect the house from fire and disease. As people hung up the cross they said this prayer: ***"May the blessing of God and the Trinity be on this cross, and on the home where it hangs and on everyone who looks at it."***

Blessed Candles will be available on the Altar in our Church in Derrinturn at 9.30am Mass on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, Candlemas Day on Thursday 2nd of February. People are welcome to bring their own candles with their names on them and leave them on the table at the Altar before Mass, to have them blessed. They can be collected after Mass.



St Blaise was a physician who eventually was ordained a bishop in the 4th Century and he worked hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his followers. His protection of those with throat ailments comes from a story of a woman whose son had a fish bone lodged in his throat. The woman brought her son to St Blaise who instantly healed him just as the boy was on the point of death. This Friday, February 3rd on the Feast day of St Blaise the Blessing of Throats takes place in Derrinturn Church at 9.30am Mass. Traditionally two candles are blessed, crossed over and pressed against either side of one's throat as a blessing is said.

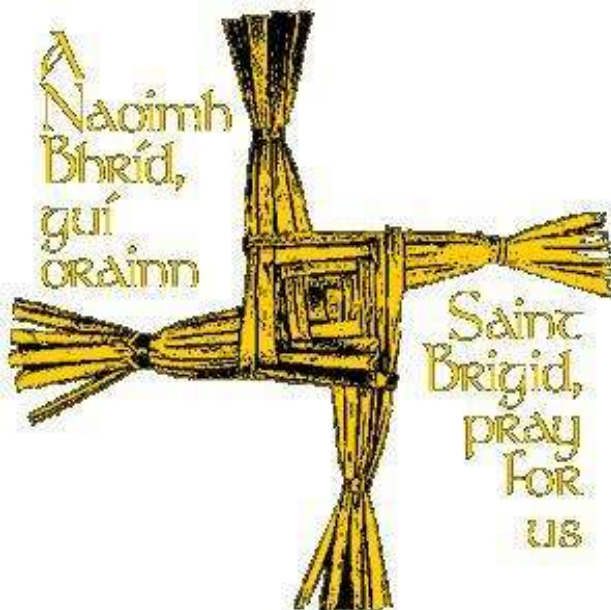
Part 4 of the Message Of His Holiness Pope Francis For The Celebration Of The Fiftieth World Day Of Peace 2017.

More powerful than violence

The Jubilee of Mercy that ended in November encouraged each one of us to look deeply within and to allow God's mercy to enter there. The Jubilee taught us to realize how many and diverse are the individuals and social groups treated with indifference and subjected to injustice and violence. They too are part of our "family"; they too are our brothers and sisters. The politics of nonviolence have to begin in the home and then spread to the entire human family. "Saint Therese of Lisieux invites us to practise the little way of love, not to miss out on a kind word, a smile or any small gesture which sows peace and friendship. An integral ecology is also made up of simple daily gestures that break with the logic of violence, exploitation and selfishness". *My invitation* 6. Peacebuilding through active nonviolence is the natural and necessary complement to the Church's continuing efforts to limit the use of force by the application of moral norms; she does so by her participation in the work of international institutions and through the competent contribution made by so many Christians to the drafting of legislation at all levels. Jesus himself offers a "manual" for this strategy of peacemaking in the Sermon on the Mount. The eight Beatitudes (cf. *Mt* 5:3-10) provide a portrait of the person we could describe as blessed, good and authentic. Blessed are the meek, Jesus tells us, the merciful and the peacemakers, those who are pure in heart, and those who hunger and thirst for justice.
