Prayer for Vocations: 2017 marks the 100th Anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima. To coincide with this event, the Bishops' Council for Vocations in collaboration with Saint Joseph's Young Priests Society, the Knights of Saint Columbanus and Vocations Ireland have asked that on the opening day of the centenary celebrations, 13th of May, a time of prayer will be held for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life in Ireland. On the same day in Ireland people are invited to pray the Angelus or a decade of the Rosary for vocations to the priesthood and religious life at 12 noon in their own homes. It is also encouraged that on the 13th of each month, from May to October 2017, a decade of the rosary be prayed for vocations in Ireland.

The Iona Institute; Invitation to a talk entitled Sweden; life in 'the secular paradise'. The talk takes place on Thursday the 18th of May at 8pm in the Davenport Hotel, Dublin 2 and admission is free. It is fair to say that Sweden receives favourable coverage in the Irish media, as it does in the Western Media generally. It is renowned for its generous and egalitarian social policy. The influence of religion upon Swedish society is very small these days, including that of the formerly dominant Lutheran Church. All in all Sweden is seen and presented as a sort of 'secular paradise', which Ireland would do well to emulate. Our guest speakers are Husband and wife, Mattias and Ruth Nordstrom. Mattias is a Lutheran theologian and pastor at Word of Life Church for Young Adults in Uppsala in Sweden. Ruth is Senior Legal Council at an organisation called Scandinavian Human Rights Lawyers. Ruth is legally representing two Swedish Midwives who have been refused employment in Swedish hospitals because they will not help to perform abortions.

Ruth and Mattias will speak about life in Sweden. They will discuss its pros and cons. They will talk about what it is like in a country that has become so secular and in which religion has been pushed to the margins of life. They will look at issues like abortion and conscience in Sweden, the state of marriage and family life, and how Christians in Sweden are responding to the challenges they face.

May the 13th is the anniversary the of apparition of Our Lady to three shepherd children in village the small of Fatima in Portugal 1917. She appeared six times to Lucia, 9, and her cousins Francisco, 8, and sister Jacinta, his between May 13, 1917 and October 13, 1917.



The story of Fatima begins in 1916, when, against the backdrop of the First World War which had introduced Europe to the most horrific and powerful forms of warfare yet seen, and a year before the Communist revolution would plunge Russia and later Eastern Europe into six decades of oppression under militant atheistic governments, a resplendent figure appeared to the three children who were in the field tending the family sheep. "I am the Angel of Peace," said the figure, who appeared to them two more times that year.

Then, on the 13th day of the month of Our Lady, May 1917, an apparition of 'a woman all in white, more brilliant than the sun' presented itself to the three children saying "Please don't be afraid of me, I'm not going to harm you." Lucia asked her where she came from and she responded, "I come from Heaven." The woman wore a white mantle edged with gold and held a rosary in her hand. The woman asked them to pray and devote themselves to the Holy Trinity and to "say the Rosary every day, to bring peace to the world and an end to the war." She also revealed that the children would suffer, especially from the unbelief of their friends and families, and that the two younger children, Francisco and Jacinta would be taken to Heaven very soon but Lucia would live longer in order to spread her message and devotion to the Immaculate Heart. In the last apparition the woman revealed her name in response to Lucia's question: "I am the Lady of the Rosary."

Perhaps the most well known utterance of the apparition of Our Lady at Fatima was her confident declaration that "My Immaculate Heart will triumph". Cardinal Ratzinger has interpreted this utterance as follows: "The Heart open to God, purified by contemplation of God, is stronger than guns and weapons of every kind. The fiat of Mary, the word of her heart, has changed the history of the world, because it brought the Saviour into the world—because, thanks to her Yes, God could become man in our world and remains so for all time. The Evil One has power in this world, as we see and experience continually; he has power because our freedom continually lets itself be led away from God. But since God himself took a human heart and has thus steered human freedom towards what is good, the freedom to choose evil no longer has the last word. From that time forth, the word that prevails is this: "In the world you will have tribulation, but take heart; I have overcome the world" (Jn 16:33). The message of Fatima invites us to trust in this promise.
