Update on Planned Renovation of Kilshanroe Church.

I am pleased to let you know that plans for the renovation of Kilshanroe church are now underway, thank God. In recent weeks, a planning application has been submitted to Kildare Co. Co. Regarding external alterations to the front porch and to replace the existing windows and doors. Internally, we would like to replace the seating, change the size and shape of the altar, replace the altar furniture, internal doors and flooring and upgrade the sound system and central heating system. All of the proposed plans, both external and internal, will be presented to parishioners for consultation and feedback before any final plans are agreed upon. Since our parish loan cleared this time last year, the parish has accumulated approximately €100,000 toward the cost of this project and I would like to take this opportunity to thank you most sincerely for your ongoing support, generosity and prayers. Pope Francis Quotes on Abortion and the Right to Life

"It is necessary to reaffirm our solid opposition to any direct offence against life, especially when innocent and defenceless and the unborn child in its mother's womb is the quintessence of innocence. Let us remember the words of Vatican Council II: Therefore from the moment of conception life must be guarded with the greatest care while abortion and infanticide are unspeakable crimes"

Timetable for Amoris Parish Programme: The Joy of Love Parish Conversations. Ahead of the WMOF2018, Pope Francis has invited us to reflect on his letter, The Joy of Love, and to begin to have a conversation about what he is saying about the family today.

Pope Francis offers us a vision for marriage and family which he believes is realistically attainable. At the same time he calls for compassion and a reaching out to those who for any reason cannot achieve that vision. This year Ash Wednesday and St Valentine's Day are on the 14th of February. Why not forget about chocolates and go to St Conleth's National School at 8pm and hear Pope Francis and then talk about the importance of family. This will take place for the six weeks of Lent. It promises to be interesting and varied. Parents of young families and others are invited to hear the Pope's take on family life. Plates may fly! The Pope says it.

10 Values of the Heart of the Ministry of Pope Francis



- 1) All things are connected: All things hold together. Bringing God's love to bear lifts everything. There is an inseparable bond between concern for nature, justice for the poor commitment to society and interior peace (Laudato Si' 10)
- 2) *Joy:* Our Christian joy is rooted in the truth of our faith that God exists and that God is love.
- 3) **Compassion:** Pope Francis sees so much human suffering, and in that suffering he hears the voice of God calling to our world to change to become fair, just, to show respect for our planet and for each person.
- 4) Hope: God is at work among us, actively building a society of love. Our task is to cooperate with this activity wherever we find it. Whatever issues we are tackling, God is already there at work before us.
- 5) Calm: We need to develop in ourselves a spirit of calm and prayer rooted in hope so that in the midst of challenges and difficulties of our world we never lose our sense of the presence of God.
- 6) *Urgency:* Pope Francis compares the church to a field hospital in a battlefield. As in any field hospital, we have to make priorities some wounds are more urgent.
- 7) New ways of doing things: While the core of the Gospel message is always the same, as followers of Jesus we have to be creative and courageous about how we share that message.
- 8) We are fragile: We are called by God to live lives of love but we fall short so often. We do not always live up to our best selves. God's most basic way of showing love is through mercy a bending of the heart, a heartfelt gesture of solidarity, compassion and consolation towards any person or creature in need, including ourselves, regardless of whether that need is our own fault or not. The opposite of mercy is heartless.
- 9) We grow with time: As human beings, we are "works in progress" until the moment we die. There is always a tension between the invitation of Jesus to live the Gospel more fully and the reality of our lives right now. But the gap between these two 'spaces' is less important than our trusting that God will bridge the gap, over time, if we cooperate with his grace.
- 10) Stay in touch with reality: A core conviction of Pope Francis is that reality is more important than ideas. Our ideas need to stay in touch with reality. Pope Francis has a deep respect for the capacity of each person, in the sacred space of conscience, to enter into conversation with God about our lives and to come to an informed decision on what is best to do.
