Stations of the Cross - Derrinturn Church for Lent 2018: The Stations of the Cross will take place on Good Friday the 30<sup>th</sup> of March at 7.30pm. As we meditate on the Stations, we are moved to renounce sin and to accept Jesus as our Saviour. When we look at the images we see the following: <u>The First Station</u>: Jesus is

Condemned to Death. <u>The Second Station</u>: Jesus Takes Up His Cross. <u>The Third Station</u>: Jesus Falls the First Time. <u>The Fourth Station</u>: Jesus Meets His Mother. <u>The Fifth Station</u>: Simon Helps Jesus to Carry His Cross. <u>The Sixth Station</u>: Veronica Wipes the Face of Jesus. <u>The Seventh Station</u>: Jesus Falls the Second Time. <u>The Eighth Station</u>: Jesus Speaks to the Women of Jerusalem. <u>The Ninth Station</u>: Jesus Falls the Third Time. <u>The Tenth Station</u>: Jesus is Stripped of His Clothes. <u>The Eleventh Station</u>: Jesus is Nailed to the Cross. <u>The Twelfth Station</u>: Jesus Dies on the Cross. <u>The Thirteenth Station</u>: Jesus is Taken Down from the Cross. <u>The Fourteenth Station</u>: Jesus is Laid in the Tomb. Everyone is always welcome to visit our churches and reflect on the Stations of the Cross any time.

The Irish Catholic Bishops' Conference has warmly welcomed the announcement today by the Holy Father Pope Francis that he will attend part of the 9th World Meeting of Families which will take place from 21 – 26 August in Dublin on the theme, 'The Gospel of the Family: Joy for the World'. Pope Francis, who is 81 years of age, will arrive in Dublin on Saturday, 25 August, and will take part in the 'Festival of Families' in Croke Park. The Festival of Families is the faith-based cultural concert of the World Meeting of Families six-day programme. The next day, Sunday 26 August, Pope Francis will be the chief celebrant at Holy Mass in the Phoenix



Park and this liturgy will bring to a conclusion the World Meeting of Families 2018. Full details of the papal schedule will be released at a later date. The bishops said, "On behalf of the faithful of Ireland we warmly welcome today's announcement, by the Holy Father himself, that he plans to visit Dublin in August for the World Meeting of Families. We are deeply honoured that Pope Francis will come to our country to participate in this universal Church celebration of faith and joy, as well as of the contemporary challenges which face families. With great anticipation we also look forward to hearing the apostolic guidance of His Holiness during his stay with us."

This Sunday is Palm Sunday, the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified. Palm Sunday is known as such because the faithful will often receive palm fronds which they use to participate in the re-enactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the towns people who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign

of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect. Palm branches are widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday.

The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

A week later, Christ would rise from the dead on the first Easter. During Palm Sunday Mass, palms are distributed to parishioners in the church. The palms are blessed and many people will fashion them into small crosses or other items of personal devotion. These may be returned to the church, or kept for the year. Because the palms are blessed, they may not be discarded. Instead, they are appropriately gathered at the church and incinerated to create the ashes that will be used in the follow year's Ash Wednesday observance.
