

When a devastating landslide struck Freetown, the capital of Sierra Leone on August 14th, four minutes is all it took to destroy the hillside community of Matome. The area is a bustling suburb of Freetown with hundreds of makeshift homes sprawling precariously up and down the mountains. Kumba is 7 years old. Her family was one of the only families to survive the disaster. 80% of those who lived in the

A guide to Christianity for the 21st Century: the new Apostolic Exhortation of Pope Francis

On April 9th, which this year marks the transferred Solemnity of the Annunciation, the Vatican releases the latest Apostolic Exhortation from Pope Francis: Gaudete et exsultate: On the call to holiness in today's world. "The Lord asks everything of us, and in return offers us true life, the happiness for which we were created." In his

third Apostolic Exhortation (following *Evangelii gaudium* and *Amoris laetitia*) Pope Francis reflects on the call to holiness, and how we can respond to that call in the modern world. "*My modest goal*" in the Exhortation, Pope Francis says, "is to repropose the call to holiness in a practical way for our own time." The five chapters of *Gaudete et exsultate* follow a logical progression, beginning with a consideration of the call to holiness as it is in itself. The Holy Father than examines two "*subtle enemies of holiness*," namely, contemporary gnosticism and contemporary pelagianism

Holiness in living the Beatitudes: The heart of Gaudete et exsultate is dedicated to the idea that holiness means following Jesus. In this third chapter, Pope Francis considers each of the Beatitudes as embodying what it means to be holy. But if the Beatitudes show us what holiness means, the Gospel also shows us the criterion by which we will be judged: "I was hungry and you gave me food... thirsty and you gave me drink... a stranger and you welcomed me... naked and you clothed me... sick and you took care of me... in prison and you visited me." Pope Francis devotes the fourth chapter of Gaudete et exsultate to "certain aspects of the call to holiness" that he feels "will prove especially meaningful" in today's world: perseverance, patience and meekness; joy and a sense of humour; boldness and passion; the communal dimension of holiness; constant prayer.

Spiritual combat and discernment: Finally, the Exhortation makes practical suggestions for living out the call to holiness. "The Christian life is a constant battle," the Pope says. "We need strength and courage to withstand the temptations of the devil and to proclaim the Gospel." In the fifth chapter, he speaks about the need for "combat" and vigilance, and calls us to exercise the gift of discernment, "which is all the more necessary today," in a world with so many distractions that keep us from hearing the Lord's voice. "It is my hope," Pope Francis concludes, "that these pages will prove helpful by enabling the whole Church to devote herself anew to promoting the desire for holiness."

Archbishop Eamon Martin has welcomed the publication today of Gaudete et exsultate, On the call to holiness in today's world, an Apostolic Exhortation by Pope Francis. Archbishop Martin said, "I welcome the publication today by Pope Francis of Gaudete et exsultate, an Apostolic Exhortation on the call to holiness in today's world. One of the great insights of the Second Vatican Council was its teaching on the universal call to holiness, something that is particularly evident in chapter 5 of Lumen Gentium, the Dogmatic Constitution of the Church. In his new publication Pope Francis has reinforced this essential teaching of Vatican II and reinterpreted it for the contemporary world. 'My modest goal' says Pope Francis in the Exhortation, 'is to repropose the call to holiness in a practical way for our own time.' In emphasising the centrality of holiness being found in following Jesus, the Holy Father also highlights the hallmarks associated with this following of the Lord." Archbishop Martin concluded, "The publication of today's Apostolic Exhortation by Pope Francis is a great

opportunity for all of us, lay, ordained and consecrated, to refocus our lives on what is the central point of our faith in Jesus."	he
