The Mission of the Parish

The Parish is a community of people, who are inspired by Jesus and committed to proclaiming God's dream for our world through word and action. The mission of the Parish is the continuation of Jesus' justice and freedom in this specific community, in this corner of the world. The Parish is where people publicly express and celebrate their faith.

Parish Pastoral Council

The Parish Pastoral Council is a faith-filled leadership group through which priests and people work together as co-responsible partners in furthering the mission of Christ in their own parish. It will typically consist of between 8-15 people and members should be reflective of the whole community in terms of age, gender, cultural diversity etc. As a pastoral council, its primary concern is pastoral issues, not administration, buildings, management or finance, which are the responsibility of other groups.

A key task of the parish pastoral council is pastoral planning

This calls us to discern how and where God is calling us as a Catholic Community in the Parish.

Three stages of pastoral planning: Review: Investigate and name the reality

Reflect: Pray, explore and discern possibilities and ways forward for the parish

Recommend planning and engaging other parishioners in specific actions.

Areas of concern for a parish pastoral council

1. Community life
2. Faith formation
3. Worship and prayer
4. Care and Reaching out

The Following experiences are necessary for all pastoral council members

Baptism, practicing the catholic faith, in full communion with the church, a regular attender of mass in the parish, supporting the parish through giving of time, energy and finances, aware of the nature, role and work of the ppc, understanding that you will be working as part of a team.

Some examples of useful skills are

Communication skills, Motivator, Facilitation, Listener, Organiser, Delegator, people management, Leadership, Good listener, Ability to speak the truth, Discerning, ability to make and act on decisions.

Vision, Committed, Prudence, Discretion, Adaptable, Eagerness to help in achieving the vision of the parish/Diocese, Approachable, Christian integrity, Perseverance, Faith & Prayerful.
