'Stations of the Cross in this time of Pandemic' This Lent the diocese is offering a video series, led by Bishop Denis, with three stations each week. The Stations can be accessed on kandle.ie from 3pm each Friday during Lent, as well as on the Kandle Facebook page. It is also available in written format for those who prefer to pray the stations in that way. The video reflections are read by people from the diocese who have been seriously impacted by COVID.

Bringing Home Holy Week 2021: Is a resource for the home for Holy Week. In it you will find, for each day from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, a note on the day, a piece of scripture, some things to look out for when joining a livestream liturgy, a short prayer ritual for use in the home as well as some 'to do' suggestions. Don't forget this weekend Clocks go Forward - Saturday night/Sunday morning March 28th at 1am, which means you should put your clock forward by 1 hour. Daylight Saving Time or "Summer Time," as it's known in many parts of the world was created to make better use of the long sunlight hours of the summer. By "springing" clocks forward an hour in March, we move an hour of daylight from the morning to the evening.

Holy Week 2021: A most special week For Christians, Holy Week is the most important week of the year. Holy Week lasts from Palm Sunday until Easter Sunday and reaches its highpoint in what we call the Easter Triduum – those three great days from the evening Mass of the Lord’s Supper to Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. Reflecting on the Scriptures and turning to ritual and symbols, Christians throughout the world, journey with Jesus through those final days of his life, his passion, his death and resurrection. In the process, we experience God’s redemptive presence, our faith is deepened, our hope is renewed and our commitment to living a life of love of God and one another is strengthened.

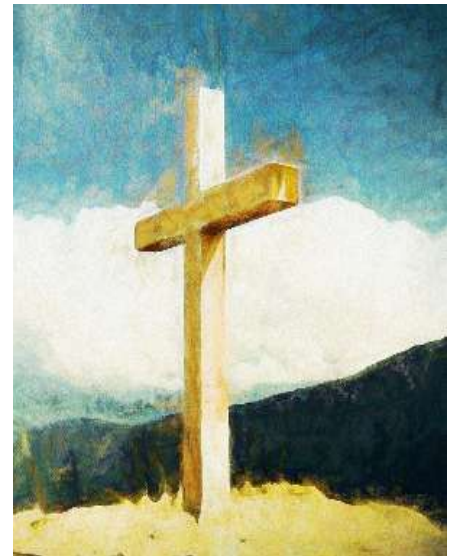
A different way of praying as a community of faith

As a Christian Community, we cannot gather together for our usual religious services. This will not prevent us from uniting spiritually and taking time to pray, to reflect and to make this Holy Week a truly enriching experience of the presence of God in our lives.

Some suggestions for Keeping Holy Week

- Create a sacred space in your home for the week. It can be as simple as a candle and a bible. You can add particular symbols for given days, palm on Palm Sunday, a water bowl & towel on Holy Thursday, a cross on Good Friday, a candle and holy water for Easter Sunday.
- Take time each day for prayer: Join in a livestream liturgy from your parish / use the daily prayer ritual in Bringing Holy Week Home 2021 on Kandle.ie or the Kandle Facebook page /read the readings of the day and go out for a walk as you reflect on them.
- Visit your local parish church for some private prayer and a physical connection with your parish
- See Bringing Holy Week Home 2021 for ‘to do’ suggestions for each day of Holy Week.



A Prayer on Easter Sunday Lord of all life: You are our hope and our joy, our source of true happiness. We have journeyed to Easter and in the most difficult of trials we have renewed our baptism and proclaimed your resurrection. We embrace with gladness the new life to which you call each one of us. Bless us, our families and all the world, with your constant presence and protection. May we give you thanks every day and share the good news of our faith with all we meet. Make the Sign of the Cross, as you pray: If you have Holy Water, use it to bless yourself as you make the Sign of the Cross.
