Community Garden: Anybody is welcome to come and help in the community garden and sowing season is about to begin. It is very good for children to let them see how nature works. The community garden is located beside the Parochial House. People are welcome to drop in any time of the day or evening and have a look around.

Living 'Laudato Sí' This week consider turning off lights and unplugging appliances not in use. Appliances on standby can use up to 20% of the electricity used when they are turned on. 'An inadequate presentation of Christian anthropology gave rise to a wrong understanding of the relationship between human beings and the world. Often, what was handed on was a Promethean vision of mastery over the world, which gave the impression that the protection of nature was something that only the faint-hearted cared about. Instead, our "dominion" over the universe should be understood more properly in the sense of responsible stewardship.' (Laudato Sí 116)

Family Carers Ireland: Family Carers Ireland in partnership with An Garda Síochána, the National Ambulance Service Community First Responder Schemes, The Irish Red Cross and The Order of Malta has developed an Emergency Card Scheme for family carers.

Easter Water for the Home – A message from Bishop Denis

Up to March of 2020, people invariably blessed themselves with holy water as they entered a church. This gesture reminds us of and stirs up the waters of our baptism. Alas, this is one of the many things that Covid has taken from us.

Priests have asked me about the possibility of making Easter water available for use in the home. While we are still in the midst of the Easter season, a season which has baptism at its heart, I would encourage you to continue this popular and worthwhile tradition. A number of parishes are already doing so in this Eastertide. At this time we need to continue to support the domestic church in any way we can and the presence of holy water in the home can be a powerful domestic reminder of our baptism. This blessed water can be placed in a font by the door of the home or it might be used in a blessing of the home and household. So while, for the moment, we cannot bless ourselves with holy water in a church, holy water can have a place in the domestic Church.

The text found in the Missal on p 1354 can be used to bless water, using the option for during Easter Time. [If there is no congregation present, you might omit the line in the introduction on page 1353 that says: 'which will be sprinkled on us']

Parishes may choose to distribute water in small, individual bottles or to facilitate water containers from the home being filled from a large vessel inside or outside the church. In either case, parishes will need to be mindful of Covid safety, for example making hand sanitizers/wipes available if taps have to be turned on or off.
