## An Advent Tradition for Church and Home:

**The Advent Wreath:** We invite you to continue or start the tradition of having an Advent wreath in the home. The advent wreath has a rich meaning. The **circle** of the wreath, with no beginning or end, symbolises the eternity of God. The **evergreen** reminds us of the everlasting life we have in Christ while any pine cones or pods in the wreath represent new life and resurrection. The **four candles** represent the four Sundays of Advent. **Purple** is traditionally a colour of penance and prayer while the **rose-pink** candle that is lit on the



Third Sunday (Gaudete/Rejoice Sunday) marks our joy as we move ever closer to Christmas. As you light a candle on your Advent wreath for the first time, pray this prayer of blessing and take a moment talk to God about how you will journey through Advent this year alone or as a household. Finish your time of prayer, again, with the Advent prayer: Come, Lord Jesus!

<u>A Blessing Prayer:</u> Loving God, let your blessing come upon us as we light this wreath. May it be a sign of hope for us as we prepare for your coming & may it turn our hearts to you in the days ahead. Give us & the world your peace and love as we wait in joyful hope. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!

**The Praver of Advent: Come, Lord Jesus:** 'Come, Lord Jesus' is the prayer and the cry of God's people in Advent. If we pause and look around our world, we know that this is a prayer that needs to be prayed. In this year we are praying especially across the diocese that the peace and light of the Lord Jesus, the Prince of Peace, will overcome the darkest depths of conflict in our world and that all people will come to know and live in peace, as is the will of God. Bishop Denis and the Diocesan Commission for Liturgical Formation invite people across the diocese to pray the Advent Household Prayer throughout Advent. As we undertake our Advent waiting, we do so in hope, for we know that Jesus is our peace, our salvation, the One for whom we long and the One who is already with us. In a world of conflict and division, how will you let the Prince of Peace into those corners of your life where he is most needed? As a new Church year begins, we pray, 'Come, Lord Jesus' - the One who was, who is and who is to come. For through Him *hope* overcomes despair, *peace* overcomes division, *joy* overcomes desolation, *love* overcomes hatred. *Maranatha! Come, Lord Jesus!* 

<u>Weekly Advent Gospel Link:</u> The First Sunday of Advent marks the start of Year B in the three-year cycle of Sunday readings in the Church. For the next year, on a Sunday we will hear mainly from the Gospel of Mark. Today, as we step into the season of Advent, Mark's gospel urges us to 'Be on your guard, stay awake'. (Chapter 13, Verse 33) This passage is a strong reminder to us to ready ourselves for the coming of the Lord, to be attentive for God at work in our world and in our lives, to take time to pray to God who in love will give us the strength to face our lives in confidence. With hope in the Lord, we believe that Jesus is coming to us all the time. While in our Mass we pray, 'we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ' we must be ready and prepared to welcome Him into our lives today. *Are we ready to do this? Are we prepared to let Jesus into the 'stuff' of our lives, into all those corners where he can bring us the hope that comes from Him alone? What would that mean? What might that look like?* Why not spend time reflecting on the Sunday Scriptures this Advent. See kandle.ie for our weekly Scripture Sharing Reflections on the Advent Sunday readings and look out for a local scripture sharing group. If there isn't one, why not create one yourself and invite others to it. This year, the reflections are taken from homilies preached by the late Fr John Cummins and found in the recently published book, 'My Life In Your Hands, Year B & Year C'
