About the speakers:

Mairead Finnegan: After completing her BA and MA in Medieval Irish and History, Mairead commenced a PhD in Medieval Irish at Maynooth University. Her research focuses on dress and accessories in Ireland and, furthermore, the role of attire in shaping Irish identity in the medieval world. Mairead has also been a member of Edenderry Historical Society for a number of years.

Tiago de Oliveira Veloso Silva: Originally from Brazil, Tiago is a PhD researcher in the department of Early Irish at Maynooth University funded by Research Ireland. His research investigates how women exercised power through patronage of the Church and operated social and familial networks to exercise their agency in 12th-century Ireland, with a special focus on Clonard. Tiago is also part of the ongoing project "Power and Patronage in medieval Ireland: Clonard from the sixth to twelfth centuries," and producer of the podcast "The Medieval Irish History Podcast". Jubilee Year 2025 – 'A call to action!' The celebration of Jubilee 2025 has now begun throughout the universal Catholic Church on the theme: 'Pilgrims of Hope'. Reflecting the Jubilee Year in the Universal Church, the Irish Synodal Pathway will also focus on hope ahead of the national presynodal assembly in Kilkenny on 18 October next. Top Ten Ways to Help Pollinators: Manage and plant native hedgerows for biodiversity

The more blossom your hedgerow has in Spring, the better it is for biodiversity. Allow hedges to grow into a natural A-shape profile rather than a neat box shape. Why: Native hedgerow plants such as Hawthorn (also called Whitethorn), and Blackthorn flower early in Spring, providing vital food for wild bees when they emerge from hibernation.
